FACTS ABOUT DOMESTIC VIOLENCE IN NORTH DAKOTA

January – December 2007

1,179 new victims (new = unduplicated for calendar year) received services from crisis intervention
centers in North Dakota. This number reflects a 3% decrease from the same period in 2006.

- **4,496 incidents** of domestic violence were reported to crisis intervention centers in North Dakota. This reflects a **5%** decrease from the same reporting period in 2006.
- □ At least **4,673 children** were directly impacted by these incidents.
- □ **149 women** (**4% of total new victims**) were pregnant at the time they were assaulted. This reflects a **3%** increase over the same period in 2006.
- □ 95% of the victims were women.
- □ At least 41% of the victims were under the age of 30. At least 1% was under the age of 18.
- □ 13% of the new victims were disabled. Of those disabled, 16% were developmentally delayed, 30% were physically disabled and 54% suffered from mental illness.
- □ 28% of the victims were self-referred to domestic violence programs; 23% were referred by law enforcement.
- □ Weapons were used in at least 12% of the cases identified. Guns were used in 25% of the cases involving weapons and knives were used in 26% of the cases involving weapons.
- □ **Law enforcement officers** were called to respond in **46%** of the incidents. In at least **43%** of those incidents, an arrest was made.
- □ At least **74%** of victims served **were physically abused**.
- □ 1,233 (30%) of victims served were abused by a former spouse or former partner.
- □ Alcohol use by abuser only was indicated in 36% of the new cases. Alcohol use by both victim and offender was indicated in 9% of the cases.
- □ The abuser had a history of abusive behavior with other adults, including prior partners, in at least 45% of the cases.
- □ Domestic violence programs provided victim assistance with **670 emergency protection orders,** an **11%** decrease from the same period in 2006.
