## FACTS ABOUT DOMESTIC VIOLENCE IN NORTH DAKOTA

## January - December 2014

<b>4,816 new victims</b> (new = unduplicated for calendar year) received services from crisis intervention centers in North Dakota.
<b>5,181 incidents</b> of domestic violence were reported to crisis intervention centers in North Dakota.
At least 4,228 children were directly impacted by these incidents.
121 women (3% of total new victims) were pregnant at the time they were assaulted.
94% of the victims were women.
At least 21% of the victims were under the age of 25. At least 1% were under the age of 18.
15% of the new victims were disabled. Of those disabled, 16% were developmentally delayed, 33% were physically disabled and 50% suffered from mental illness.
32% of the victims were <b>self-referred</b> to domestic violence programs; 28% were <b>referred</b> by <b>law enforcement</b> .
Weapons were used in at least 13% of the cases identified. Guns were used in 22% of the cases involving weapons and knives were used in 37% of the cases involving weapons.
Law enforcement officers were called to respond in 55% of the incidents. In at least 42% of those incidents, an arrest was made.
At least 78% of victims served were physically abused.
1,353 (28%) of victims served were abused by a former spouse or former partner.
Alcohol use by abuser only was indicated in 35% of the new cases. Alcohol use by both victim and offender was indicated in 9% of the cases.
The abuser had a history of abusive behavior with other adults, including prior
