FACTS ABOUT DOMESTIC VIOLENCE IN NORTH DAKOTA

January – December 2015

5,356 new victims (new = unduplicated for calendar year) received services from crisis intervention centers in North Dakota.
5,620 incidents of domestic violence were reported to crisis intervention centers in North Dakota.
At least 2,215 children were directly impacted by these incidents.
139 women (3% of total new victims) were pregnant at the time they were assaulted.
93% of the victims were women.
At least 21% of the victims were under the age of 25. At least 1% were under the age of 18.
13% of the new victims were disabled. Of those disabled, 16% were developmentally delayed, 35% were physically disabled and 49% suffered from mental illness.
31% of the victims were self-referred to domestic violence programs; 30% were referred by law enforcement.
Weapons were used in at least 10% of the cases identified. Guns were used in 24% of the cases involving weapons and knives were used in 33% of the cases involving weapons.
Law enforcement officers were called to respond in 58% of the incidents. In at least 39% of those incidents, an arrest was made.
At least 78% of victims served were physically abused.
1,382 (26%) of victims served were abused by a former spouse or former partner.
Alcohol use by abuser only was indicated in 32% of the new cases. Alcohol use by both victim and offender was indicated in 9% of the cases.
The abuser had a history of abusive behavior with other adults, including prior
